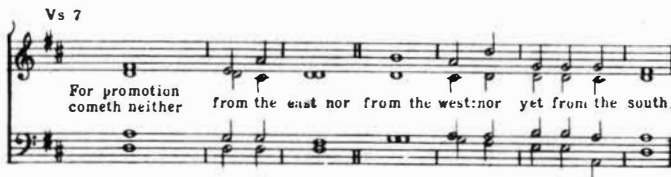


- UNTO thee O God do ' we give ' thanks : yea unto ' thee do ' we give
