- 14 He fashioneth all the hearts of *them* : and *under-stand-eth* all their^eworks.
- 15 There is no king that can be saved by the multitude of an *host* : neither is any mighty man *deliver-ed* by much strength.
- 16 A horse is counted but a vain thing to save a *man* : neither shall he deliver any man *by* his great strength.
- 17 Behold, the eye of the Lord is upon them that *fear* him : and upon them that put their trust *in* his mer-cy ;
- 18 To deliver their soul from *death* : and to feed them *in* the time of^edearth.
- 19 Our soul hath patiently tarried for the *Lord* : for he is our *help* and our shield.
- 20 For our heart shall rejoice in *him* : because we have hoped *in* his ho-ly^eName.
- 21 Let thy merciful kindness, O Lord, be up-*on* us : like as we do *put* our trust in^ethee.
